

NJ School Funding and Property Taxes

Senator Mike Doherty, our NJ 23rd District Senator, recently visited out Town Council Meeting to discuss his "Fair School Funding Plan". While the attendance was low, Senator Doherty's message speaks to all those in Califon who believe their property taxes are exorbitantly high.

The message Senator Doherty conveyed was clear - 85% of NJ's municipalities, including Califon, are funding, through income taxes for school state aid, 15% of NJ's schools. For instance, when comparing Califon to Asbury Park, for every dollar of income tax Califon sends to Trenton, Asbury Park receives 15 dollars. Obviously, because Califon receives less state aid than what it contributes in income tax and much less state aid than Asbury Park, Califon must rely on property taxes to provide school funding.

With Senator Doherty's "Fair School Funding" plan, NJ's municipalities would receive the same state aid amount per student. If this occurred, Califon would receive \$1.35 in state aid for every \$1.00 sent to Trenton, an increase of over 450% in school funding. This increase in school state aid could lower property taxes significantly.

The issue of school funding in New Jersey will continue to be inequitable as long as the current system remains in place. Senator Doherty is pushing for change to the current school funding policy, working with his peers on government to make this change occur. You may want to consider this issue the next time you visit the polls on Election Day.

Hunterdon County is conducting a Household Hazardous Waste Cleanup Day on Saturday, July 14 at the Hunterdon County Library Complex, 314 State Rt. 12, Flemington from 9:00am until 1:00pm (rain or shine).

Up to 10 gallons or 80 pounds of the following will be accepted: Latex Paint*, Varnish/Stains, Herbicides, Gas/ Oil Mix, Mercury, Oil Based Paint*, Insecticides, Pool Chemicals, Photographic Chemicals, Fuel Oil/Sludge, Fire Extinguishers, Paint Thinner, Pesticides, Aerosol Cans, Battery Acid, Diesel Fuel, Thermostats, Asbestos Pipe Wrap, Gasoline, Kerosene, Drain Cleaner and Fluorescent tubes**.

*Consolidate latex paints and oil based paints, keeping them type separated, to make full cans.

**Wrap fluorescent tubes in newspaper or put back in original sleeve.

Unlimited quantities of the following will be accepted: Used Motor Oil, Anti-Freeze and Automotive Batteries.

The following will **NOT** be accepted: Empty Containers, Pentachlorophenol, Tires, Radioactive Materials, PCB's, Electronics, Explosives, Silvex, Propane Tanks, Air Conditioners, Solid Waste and Helium Tanks.
