The year 2012 may fade away, but the heros of Califon remain. Superstorm Sandy caused ten to twelve days without electrical power in the Borough. However, we soon found out that others - in neighboring states, the Jersey shore, local communities, maybe even our next door neighbor - suffered more damage than we did. Without a doubt, most individuals rose up to the call to help their neighbors.

Califon's Emergency Response Team was lead by Beth Wolfmayer, our Emergency Management Coordinator. For the first two nights of the storm, Beth worked without rest, coordinating communications and dispatches between the County's Office of Emergency Management (OEM), Califon's Fire Department and Rescue Squad. The following days had Beth checking on residents, completing status reports, and continually providing communications between Califon and the County OEM. While the storm may well be over, for Beth the volumes of paperwork that have to be completed has begun. Beth is working with FEMA to procure the financial support to deal with the aftermath. Califon is incredibly fortunate to have Beth working for all of us.

Fire Chief Bill Kibler and his staff of volunteer firefighters worked tirelessly throughout the storm, responding to emergencies within Califon and our neighboring communities. Califon's Fire Department became the Emergency Command Center during the storm. As the winds roared and the trees came down, the firefighters were dispatched to clear roads so that emergency vehicles could get through and check on reported emergencies. The Fire Department and the First Aid / Rescue Squad, led by President Jay Klein, deserve much praise and support for their work during this treacherous time.

My personal thanks to Beth, Bill, and Jay for their leadership to and endless support of the citizens of Califon.

Thanks to Pastor Chad Rogers for opening the Lower Valley Presbyterian Church as a warming/showering/kitchen center, as well as a "Voting Center" for Election Day.

Thanks to the few men (who have chosen to remain anonymous) for clearing Main Street of telephone poles and trees. JCP&L's response to this public safety issue was not timely, and these men corrected the situation!

Thanks to the resident who provided neighbors with an open house and home cooked meals. As I heard described, "The meal was equivalent to a Thanksgiving Day Feast!"

Yes, there are other 'local heros' to thank and I continue to hear about their deeds. They helped you clear the debris that fell from the trees, allowed you to "plug-in" to their generator, provided a hot shower, a room for warmth, or a hot meal. Perhaps they offered just a word of encouragement, to help you through this ordeal. These are the people who make Califon a great Borough in which to live, to work, and to raise the next generation of heros!

#### **It's Time to License Your Dog!**

A reminder to all Califon Residents - 2013 dog licenses are due by Thursday, January 31st. Licenses are issued by the Dog registrar at the Borough Municipal Offices, 39 Academy Street between the hours of 9am - 3pm Mon. - Thurs.

If your dog was licensed last year, you should receive an application in the mail. If you did not own a dog last year or you do not receive an application in the mail, you can obtain the application at our municipal offices or on the Borough's website, <a href="https://www.califonboro.net">www.califonboro.net</a> under Documents at the very bottom of the home page. Just print out the form, complete it and mail it along with: Proof of Rabies Vaccination Certificate and Certification from the veterinarian that the dog has been altered if applicable.

A Check payable to the Borough of Califon for \$11.00 if the dog has been altered or \$14.00 for an Unaltered dog.

PLEASE NOTE THERE IS A DELINQUENT FINE OF \$5.00 PER DOG, PER MONTH AFTER JANUARY 31<sup>ST</sup>. SO PLEASE GET YOUR APPLICATIONS IN EARLY!!

#### When Snow Falls this Winter.....

Please be advised that the following rules, according to Borough ordinance, will go into effect in the event of snow:

Owner(s) and/or tenant(s) of any property abutting public roads of the Borough shall remove all snow and ice from sidewalks and gutters of roads within 12 hours of daylight after snow has fallen and accumulated. A summons will be issued to violators.

Placing snow and/or ice in the Borough or County roadways, whether paved or unpaved, is strictly prohibited. Whenever snow has covered Borough streets and an emergency exists, no vehicles can park on the streets until they have been plowed sufficiently. At the time, parking on the streets will resume so long as it does not interfere with the normal flow of traffic. Violators of these rules may have their cars towed at the owner's expense. Please also be sure your house number and mailbox are clearly visible from the road to make it easier for responders to find you in the event of an emergency.
