

REMEMBER TO LICENSE YOUR DOG

If you have not yet licensed your dog there is still time! Do it now to avoid further delinquent late fees! If you do not have an application, simply print one from our website: www.califonboro.net; found under documents at the bottom of the page or simply write down on a piece of paper, Your name, address, phone number, your dog's name, age, breed, color and whether or not your dog is spayed or neutered. I also need a copy of the rabies certification if the expiration date is new from last year's licensing information. Spayed or Neutered dogs are \$11.00 and \$14.00 for an unaltered dog. There is a \$5.00 per month late fee after Jan 31st.

JONATHAN SLUSHER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Jonathan Slusher Memorial Scholarship Foundation Committee will double the number of scholarships offered this year, awarding four \$1,000 scholarships to area seniors in 2013. Students planning a career in journalism/communications are eligible.

Applicants are required to submit a written essay detailing reasons why he or she is interested in journalism/communications. Also a GPA of 3.0 or above is desirable. Interested students should speak with their guidance counselor for submission dates and other details.

All proceeds garnered from *The Race to Remember* on October 7, 2012, in Califon were applied to the scholarship fund. The Race and Foundation were established by the Slusher Family as a memorial to their son and brother, Jonathan. He succumbed to brain cancer in October, 2010, and at the time of his passing was editor of *The Hunterdon Review*. Journalism and running were his passions.

The Foundation is hoping to sponsor the second annual *Race to Remember* at Califon in October of 2013.
