ANNUAL 5K JON SLUSHER RUN/WALK SCHEDULED FOR OCT, 5

The 2014 Jon Slusher 5K Run/Walk will once again take place in Califon as an event within the Califon Street Fair. Runners will gather at the bridge in Califon and at 1PM on Sunday, October 5, and will follow the course down River Road, loop to the left at Hoffman's Crossing to enter the Columbia Trail and finish at the Califon Train Station.

For family members who do not choose to run or walk, the street fair provides entertainment and interest.

This year, the USATF-NJ Grand Prix has added the Jon Slusher

5K Run/Walk to their roster. This means runners who are members of the USA Track and Field will receive 500 points for running the race, a discounted application fee and are eligible for Grand Prix Cash Prizes.

In addition, a 70--90 year age category has been added with an accompanying trophy.

Jonathan was the victim of brain cancer and lost his heroic and courageous fight in 2010. He was an avid runner whose passion was journalism, so his family decided to sponsor an annual 5K Run for funding journalism/communication scholarships to honor their son and brother.

Enabled by generous donations and the annual Jon Slusher 5K Run/Walk, the Jonathan Slusher Memorial Scholarship Foundation (501-c-3 charity) has awarded 13 scholarships of \$1,000 each in the past three years. 2014 scholarship winners are: Devany Burke (Hunterdon Central); Kelly Fleming (North Hunterdon); Kirsten Eversen (Mendham); Reid Riccordella (West Morris); and Sean Gallagher (Mt. Olive).

RAFFLE LICENSES- WHAT YOUR ORGANIZATION NEEDS TO KNOW

Is your organization thinking about fundraising this year? Are you considering a Tricky Tray, 50- 50 raffle? If so, please make sue you are aware of the State of New Jersey Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission requirements.

A qualified organization, (Charitable organizations, Organizations or associations of veterans, religious, educational, Volunteer Fire Companies, first aid, ect) must FIRST register with the Control Commission bi-annually. Once the registration is received from the state LGCCC you can apply for a raffle license through the Borough Clerk, at least two months prior to the raffle. The application for a raffle event must first be approved via a Resolution by the Mayor and Council and it is then transmitted to the LGCCC for their approval.

FLU KILLS. HUNGER DOES TOO. FIGHT BOTH WITH ONE SHOT!

The Clinton Sunrise Rotary and Green Brook Family Medicine are once again Co-sponsoring a Community Flu Clinic at the Clinton Fire House on Saturday, September27, 2014 from 9am to 12pm and at Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Readington on Sunday September 28, 2014 from 9am to 12 pm.

Dr. Ronald Frank and Dr. Sean Cook have partnered with the Rotary Clubs of Hunterdon County to donate 100% of the clinic profits to the Hunterdon County Food Pantries to help feed those in need. Last year \$6,000 was donated as a result of this program.

Bring the entire family; vaccines will be available for adults and children 6 months of age and older at this convenient one stop clinic. Preservative-free Injectable and Nasal Spray Flu Vaccines will also be available.

No co-pays or deductibles are required for participants with most major insurances. We are unable to accept insurance plans that require you to list a primary care physician on your card or NJ Family Care/Medicaid. Please present all insurance cards at the clinic. For those without insurance, or plans that Green Brook Family Medicine does not participate with, the flu vaccine cost is \$20 for the (TIV) injectable, and \$30 for the Flu Mist nasal spray.

In addition to the proceeds from the vaccination program, non-perishable food donations will be accepted for local food pantries. For additional information please call Green Brook Family Medicine at 732-356-0266.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

According to the latest NFPA research, working smoke alarms cut the chance of dying in a fire in half. Meanwhile, almost teothirds of home fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.

In a fire, seconds count, and roughly half of home fire deaths result from fires reported at night between 11pm and 7am when most people are asleep. Home smoke alarms can alert people to a fire before it spreads, giving everyone enough time to get out.

This year's Fire Prevention Week campaign includes the following smoke alarm messages:

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area and on every level of the home, including the basement.
- Interconnect all smoke alarms throughout the home. This way, when one sounds, they all do.
- Test alarms at least monthly by pushing the test button.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or sooner if they don't respond properly.
- Make sure everyone in the home knows the sound of the smoke alarm and understands what to do when they hear it.

Your Fire Department can host activities during Fire Prevention Week to promote "Working Smoke Alarms Save Lives!" Through these educational, family-oriented activities, residents can learn more about the importance of working smoke alarms and testing them monthly.
