Califon Fit

Along about this time last year, I wrote about the many opportunities our beloved Califon offers in pursuing better health and fitness. My opinion remains unchanged . . . Califon offers tremendous health potential! But this time of year, many of us are making some very personal resolutions to “do better” and be healthier! Here are a few you may want to consider.

No matter who you are or what your age, if you’re stressed, go dancing! You know your heart benefits from exercise. Your brain does, too! Studies show that regular, moderate exercise – 30 minutes of walking or a light one-mile run helps in fighting the effects of aging on the brain. No “Iron Man” workouts required! All types of exercise count: walking, bicycling, hiking, swimming, aerobics, weight training . . . and dancing are all great exercise, especially on these cold winter days and evenings. Compelling research evidence suggests that exercise stimulates the body to fight the stress that occurs in all our lives --- stress that causes oxidative changes in the brain and contributes to premature aging. So why not de-stress and stay young with a little exercise . . . why not go dancing?

If you’re a kid, get more sleep! Lack of sleep can affect more than sleepiness in school. Childhood obesity is pandemic in the US and studies suggest an important link between skimping on sleep and being overweight. Sleep shortfalls may increase “hunger” hormones so kids eat more and are less likely to exercise and burn calories than when they’re well-rested and re-energized. Kids differ, but general guidelines from the National Sleep Foundation are as follows: ages 3-5 (11-13 hours); ages 5-12 (10-11 hours); and ages 11-17 (9+ hours). To get a good night’s sleep, keep a regular bedtime routine and: quiet down a few hours before bedtime; avoid meals just before bedtime; remove TVs, computers and gadgets from your bedroom; and make sure your bedroom is quiet, dark, relaxing and not too hot or cold.

If you smoke . . . QUIT . . . and don’t worry about weight gain! Some people pick up 4 or 5 pounds early on, but that’s only temporary. Get help and support from your primary care provider, family friends, and co-workers. Your primary care provider (doctor or advanced practice nurse) can help you tailor an approach that best suits you. There are many FDA-approved medications available to help you quit smoking. You can greatly increase your odds of quitting for good, by combining medication with other strategies like – avoiding your “smoking triggers” and changing your daily routine. Also, some foods and drinks make cigarettes taste better; some make them taste worse. Try eating more vegetables and less meat. Swap out that coffee (or alcohol) for a glass of water or milk. Let your taste buds stifle those ruthless cravings!

Being “Jersey Strong” starts with each of us as individuals and the personal decisions we make about our own health-seeking behaviors! Whatever your health goals, whatever health challenges you face, reaffirm your commitment to better health and a healthy lifestyle by being “Califon Fit!”

When the Snow Falls this Winter....

According to the Borough ordinance the following rules will go into effect in the event of snow:

Owner(s) and/ or tenant(s) of any property abutting public roads of the Borough shall remove all snow and ice from the sidewalks within 12 hours of daylight after the snow has fallen and accumulated.

A summons will be issued to violators.

Placing snow and or ice in the Borough or County roadways, whether paved or unpaved, is strictly prohibited. Whenever snow has covered Borough Streets and an emergency exists, no vehicles can park on the streets until they have been plowed sufficiently.

At the time, parking on the streets will resume so long as it does not interfere with the normal flow of traffic. Violators of these

rules may have their cars towed at the owner’s expense.

Please also make sure your house number and mailbox are clearly visible from the road to make it easier for first responders to find you in an event of an emergency.

Christmas Tree Pick Up

Please have your Christmas Trees sitting curbside by Friday January 16th. The Fire Co. will be coming around to pick them up on Saturday, January 17th. These discarded Christmas trees will be used for the “Winterfest” bonfire on January 24th. Trees can also be dropped off at the Fire Co. Carnival grounds, behind the Municipal Building. There will be a “tree drop off” sign to start stacking the trees at this location.

It's Time to License Your Dog!


All Califon Borough residents are required to license their dogs. The 2015 licenses are due by Friday January 30th. Applications are available right here in the Califon Crier, on the Califon Borough Website (www.califonboro.net) under Documents at the bottom of the web page or you can come down to the Municipal Offices and pick one up. A proof of Rabies Vaccination Certificate and proof that your dog has been altered should accompany the application if this information has not been previously provided.

Altered dogs are \$11.00 and unaltered dogs are \$14.00 to license

for the year.

Please note there is a delinquent fine of \$5.00 per dog, per month after January 31st. Please get your applications in early!!

NOTICE TO ALL DOG OWNERS

Dog Licenses must be obtained by January 31st. Please complete the application upon receipt of this mailing to avoid accruing late fees!

N.J. Fees as scheduled should be enclosed with your application along with a certificate of your dog's current rabies inoculation. Rabies inoculation must not expire during this year of licensing.

Two surcharge fees have been imposed by the State of N.J.- (1) N.J. Pilot Clinic Fund Surcharge of \$0.20; (2) N.J. Animal Control Population Fund Surcharge- \$3.00. Along with a copy of the rabies certificate we will also need a veterinarian's certificate, or and affidavit stating the animal has been altered. The proof of alteration only needs to be submitted the first time you are licensing your dog with Califon after the alteration takes place. Our system will store this information for future reference.

Fee: Spayed or Neutered dogs.....\$11.00
Unaltered Dogs.....\$14.00
