If your dog was licensed last year, you do not need to fill out another application. Just drop the check off at the Municipal Offices or mail them to Karen Mastro's attention. Licenses are \$11.00 for spayed/neutered \$14.00 for non spayed/neutered.

If your dogs rabies vaccination expired since your last licensing, I will need a copy of the new rabies certificate.
