



A Message from Califon Fire Marshall, Alan Layton

Fall is right around the corner and this is a great time to take inventory both indoors and outdoors for all of the conditions that may affect the fire safety of your home. It is a good idea to start with your shed, garage and outdoor landscape and work your way into your home. Make sure your power equipment and tools are in good working condition. Gasoline should be stored in a safety approved gasoline container, out of direct sunlight. Complete an inventory of stored paint, oils and any solvents and take the ones you are not using anymore to the Hazardous Waste Clean Up Day at the Hunterdon County Complex, 314 State Rt. 12, Flemington on November 10, 2012. Go to (www.hunterdon.nj.us/solidwaste/cleanup) for further information.

Make sure your stacked wood for the fireplace / woodstove is at least 40 feet away from any of your buildings. Firewood should not be stacked against your house or an outer building.

In your home, take this time to check all of the electrical

cords, fixtures and appliances. If in doubt, replace. Eliminate unnecessary "stuff" that can become fuel for a fire and that may create a hazard.

Police Report from Police Commissioner Kathleen Andersen

The Police have been extremely active in town over the past few months. In response to requests by residents, patrols have been increased, and speeders have been being ticketed on a regular basis. The department is currently gearing up for Back to School, providing banners and other reminders to people that school is in session.

One area of continuing concern is the issue of young people skateboarding in the roadways. Chief Bailey would like to remind parents to speak with their children about safety issues surrounding skateboarding. There are several statutes that require children that bike, skate, or skateboard to wear helmets. 39:4-1.5. The fines vary from \$25 to \$100 to be assessed to the parents of the child. 39:4-10.11 is the statute that specifies how you can operate a skateboard or roller skates on a roadway.

Mischief Night Safety

In the past several years, significant damage to both public and private property within the Borough has occurred in "Mischief Night", the night before Halloween. This year, as has been done in the past, the Mayor and Council will enact a strict curfew for the week prior to Halloween. They ask all Califon residents to honor this curfew and to please have their children, under the age of 18, home and off the streets by 9pm on October 30th. This town curfew and local ordinances will be strictly enforced by the Police Dept.; additional police officers will be on duty patrolling the Borough throughout the night. Residents are being asked to do a "neighborhood watch" and to report and unusual and suspicious activity to the police by calling (908) 876-3232. Let's hope that by working together, we can put a stop to the vandalism and damage that has occurred the last few years. We thank you all for your cooperation in keeping the community safe during the Halloween festivities.

A Race to Remember

JONATHAN SLUSHER MEMORIAL 5K RUN/WALK OCTOBER 7TH IN CALIFON

Get ready to lace up your running shoes.

Preparations are currently under way for the inaugural Jonathan Slusher Memorial 5K Run/Walk in Califon as part of the borough's annual Harvest Festival coming up on Sunday, October 7.

The date will mark the day Slusher, a former editor at the Hunterdon Review and a graduate of Voorhees High School, succumbed to brain cancer in 2010 after a year long battle with the disease. Organized by Slusher's parents, Richart and Shirley Slusher of Tewksbury, the event will raise funds for the newly-formed *Jonathan Slusher Memorial Scholarship foundation*.

This year, using funds donated in Slusher's name, the foundation awarded two journalism/communications scholarships of \$1000 each to Voorhees High School students Amanda Ocello and Sarah Martineau. In the future, proceeds from the run/walk and kids race will go toward funding scholarships for area high school students.

A talented runner, Slusher was a member of the Voorhees High School championship cross-country team in the early 1980s and was also co-captain of the same championship team. He continued to compete in races throughout his life up to one month before the brain cancer diagnosis.

RACE DETAILS:

Pre-registration for the 5K Race will cost \$20 per person prior to Sept. 15the and \$25 following Sept. 15th. Registration for children 10 and under will be \$5 while registration for a family of 4 will cost \$40. Registration forms can be found at www.johnslusher.org.

The 5K Run/Walk will start promptly at 1pm on Oct. 7th, rain or shine. The course has been sanctioned by USA Track and Field and will begin at the Califon Bridge, continues down River Road, to Hoffman's Crossing where it goes along the Columbia Trail and will end at the Califon Train Station. Because no former race times have been recorded in the past, this 2012 race winner will establish the time record. The kids Fund Run will then follow at 2pm at Califon Island Park. The event will conclude with an awards ceremony at 2:30pm with awards in the following age categories: Overall first place for a man, woman & walker. First and second place awards for age 14 and under; 15 to 19; 20 to 29; 30 to 39; 40 to 49 and 50 plus. All participating children receive ribbons.

Checks can be made payable to *The Jonathan Slusher Memorial Scholarship Foundation*, 79 Guinea Hollow Road, Lebanon, NJ 08833. The foundation is a 501-c-3 charity and all contributions are tax-deductible.
